



What table sizes do you recommend?

Each painter needs approximately 2ft x 2ft of space for their easel, palette, paintbrushes, water, and any drinks or snacks. Round tables accommodate fewer painters than square or rectangular tables, which can be placed in a row to allow alternating seats and 1-2 extra painters where they join.

Generally, if a table normally sits 4, it will comfortably sit 2 painters. We've included some common table sizes below to help you plan your party.



Some common table sizes:

Round:

Small Bistro Table - 2.5ft diameter = 1 painter.

Anything smaller, such as high tops, will be too small.

Large Bistro Table - 3.5 ft diameter = 2 painters

Small Dining Table - 4ft diameter = 3-4 painters

Patio Table - 6ft diameter = 4-5 painters



Rectangle:

Small Folding Table - 4ft x 2 ft = 2 painters

Dining Table - 5ft x 3ft = 4 painters

Midsized Folding Table - 6ft x 3ft = 5, maybe 6, painters



Square:

Small Bistro Table - 2ft x 2ft = 1 painter

Card Table - 3ft x 3ft = 2 painters

Small Dining Table - 4ft x 4ft = 4 painters
